Newport Youth Academy

The Newport Youth Academy is an inspirational, life changing provision for the young people of Newport aged between 16 and 18 years old who are not in employment, education or training (NEET).

It is one of Newport's largest training providers delivering training to young people and supporting them into employment or higher/further education.

While at the Academy, young people can earn up to $\pounds 60$ a week while gaining training, qualifications and all the support they need to progress onto the next stage of their career.

Council services recognised in the Social Care Accolades 2023

The Community Connectors attended the Social Care Accolades award ceremony at City Hall in Cardiff on 27 April 2023. They were 'Highly Commended' finalists in the Supporting Unpaid Carers category.

The judges said, "The Newport Community Connector service has done such a lot for unpaid carers; they've really gone above and beyond. The judges felt the staff were passionate, dedicated and they liked the whole team approach.

The project was praised for the way it included ethnic minorities and groups and how they helped address digital exclusion by providing unpaid carers with access to technology".

Rebecca Wilford, NCC's Carers Officer, collected the award certificate on behalf of the Connector service. Team Manager Sandra Trimarco commented, "It was fantastic for the team to receive this award in recognition of their dedicated work and, importantly, the film showed the valuable role Newport's unpaid carers have in supporting their loved ones".



A big congratulations to Oaklands who won the award for the Building Brighter Futures for Children and Families category.

Oaklands is a Newport City Council respite service for children with additional needs, offering families a break from their caring role. The judges feedback spoke about love in the care system and how the staff showed this in abundance.

The Accolades recognise and celebrates excellence in care and the afternoon was a wonderful celebration of the dedication shown by Newport City Council staff for unpaid carers and families.

Carers Network Meeting

During our recent Carers Network meetings for unpaid carers in Newport, we enjoyed listening to Ellis Redman, Wellbeing Ambassador at Newport Live, where he discussed what sports and activities offer to support wellbeing. We also listened to Damian Lines from Rubin, Lewis, O'Brien Solicitors discussing the importance of later life financial planning and offering advice on complicated matters such as power of attorney.

In May, we welcomed Age Cymru discussing their Hope Advocacy project and South Wales Police informing us of their protocols and services they have in place to protect the most vulnerable in our communities. We also enjoyed listening to Katherine Hawkins from Newport City Council discussing Age Friendly Communities.

Our next Carers Network meeting will take place on Wednesday 27 September 2023.

Newport Rising Festival Returns

November's Newport Rising Festival returns in November and commemorates the Chartist Uprising of 1839.

The uprising was the last large-scale armed rebellion against authority in Great Britain and an important milestone on the road to modern democracy. Thousands of men marched to the Westgate Hotel fighting for the right to vote and for the common people to have their voices heard. The Chartists also hoped of securing the release of five of their men who were held under arrest at the hotel. Battle broke out which saw many injured and around 22 killed.
