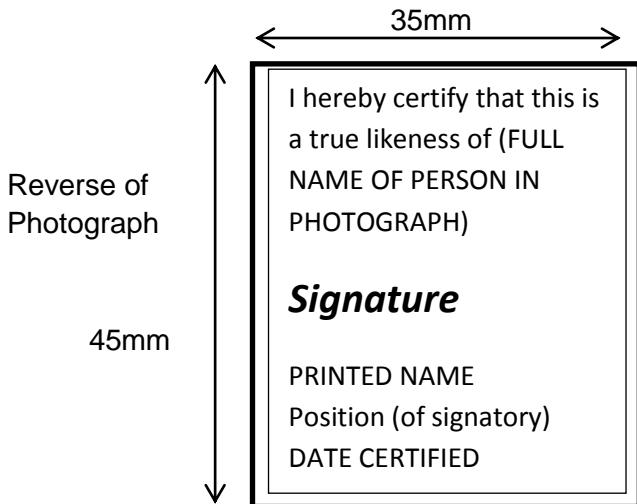


Who can certify a Personal Licence Photograph?

What is being certified?

On signing one of your two photographs, the counter-signatory is declaring that the photograph is a true likeness of you.

Below is an example of a correctly signed photograph.



Who can countersign your photographs for application?

- The counter-signatory must hold a professional qualification
- The counter-signatory may not be a spouse or relative
- Licensees may not certify photographs

Accountant	Local government officer
Articled clerk of a limited company	Manager/personnel officer (of limited company)
Assurance agent of recognised company	Member of Parliament
Bank/building society official	Merchant Navy officer
Barrister	Minister of a recognised religion
Broker	Nurse (SRN and SEN)
Chairman/Director of limited company	Officer of the armed services (active or retired)
Chemist	Optician
Chiropodist	Person with honours (eg OBE MBE etc)
Christian Science Practitioner	Photographer (professional)
Commissioner of Oaths	Police officer
Councillor: local or county	Post Office official
Civil Servant (permanent)	President/Secretary of a recognised organisation
Dentist	Salvation Army officer
Engineer (with professional qualifications)	Social worker
Fire Service official	Solicitor
Funeral director	Surveyor
Insurance agent (full time) of a recognised company	Teacher, Lecturer
Journalist	Trade Union officer
Justice of the Peace	Travel Agent (qualified)
Legal Secretary (members and fellows of the Institute of legal secretaries)	Valuer and auctioneer (fellow and associate members of the incorporated society)
	Warrant officers and Chief Petty officers

Or persons of similar standing to the above, working or retired are acceptable as counter-signatory
