1. Name and description of the policy / proposal being assessed. Outline the policy's purpose.

The proposal is to reduce the capacity of Newport City Council's internal supported living services from 4 homes to 2 homes in order to meet the changing needs of the tenants and to reflect a modernised approach to delivery of the supported living model.

Formal consultation will take place with each key stakeholder group, which includes:
Tenants and their families
Staff teams
Registered Social Landlords for the 4 homes

3. What information/evidence do you have on stakeholders? e.g. views, needs, service usage etc. Please include all the evidence you consider relevant.

Social care reviews and assessments of the tenants at each service have been completed. This has identified the need for some of the tenants to be move on from their current provision to services now more appropriate to their changing needs.

The service is already carrying 3 vacancies, which has raised doubts about the viability of the provision as it currently stands. The Registered Social Landlords, Charter Housing and Newport City Homes respectively, have raised some concerns about the rental voids that have been incurred and the potential viability of the services.

 <p>Long Term</p> <p>Balancing short term need with long term and planning for the future</p>	<p>It offers a long term approach that acknowledges the imperative of the Social Services and Well-Being Act 2014 and the Future Generations Act to reduce dependency and promote long-term sustainability.</p> <p>The current supported living services have had 3 long-term vacancies, which raise significant doubts about the ongoing sustainability of the service. On a financial basis, the current service costs an hourly rate of £25, compared to an average £15.50 in the private / 3rd sector. This proposal would result in a more efficient use of resources.</p> <p>The private and 3rd sector provision also offer a demonstrable track record developing models of supported living that offer clear pathways through to independence for their tenants.</p>
 <p>Collaboration</p> <p>Working together with other partners to deliver objectives</p>	<p>The proposal is based on some of the key strategic principles identified in Newport City Council's Independent Living Strategy 2017-22. It acknowledges the importance of building on the existing partnership work between the Council and Registered Social Landlords to develop models of supported living that are enabling and innovative. Similarly, the proposal recognises the important role of the private and voluntary sectors in developing new service models.</p>

This process has identified the need for people to move to more appropriate models of support to meet their needs as individuals. For some of the tenants, it will be particularly important to retain some of their existing links with the local community. Where possible, their care and support plans will reflect this.</p> <p data-bbox="451 862 1362 931">Formal consultation has yet to be undertaken with staff and the families of the tenants.</p> <p data-bbox="451 974 1331 1077">Some preliminary discussions have been held with the Registered Social Landlords, though not on a fully formal basis.</p>

Staff will be affected, with a reduction in services potentially resulting in job losses. However, this will result in a more viable service provision and the elimination of long term tenant vacancies in the homes.</p> <p data-bbox="451 562 1414 667">Reducing the service to 2 houses from 4 also enables the Registered Social Landlords to offer the housing stock to meet general housing needs, which will benefit the community.</p>

As the services are all located in Bettws, the direct impact is restricted to that area.
