1. Name and description of the policy / proposal being assessed. Outline the policy's purpose.

Budget Proposal: Third Sector Grants

This proposal considers the removal of unrestricted grant funding to Newport People First and Deaf Clubs across the city. The proposal suggests removing, historical and non-statutory grant funding in order to make financial savings within the Service Area's budget.

The authority has signalled its intention to remove funding provision to the organisations concerned. However, this proposal is being considered as part of the wider budget proposals that are going to full public consultation for the 2020/21 budget.

This impact assessment will be amended to reflect the nature of responses received during that consultation process.

Deaf Clubs

This funding is used by Deaf Clubs to fund room hire at various venues across the city and is used for social activities, lunch clubs, parties and gatherings. Numbers attending social events are currently not known but further consultation and engagement will be undertaken and assisted by a BSL Interpreter.

Newport People First

The funding is used by Newport People First to cover the cost of an administrator and the cost of hiring a permanent office space in Newport Market. The organisation provides opportunity for self advocacy for up to 90 members (currently 20 active members) and promotes greater awareness of the needs of adults with learning disabilities principally within statutory organisations.
