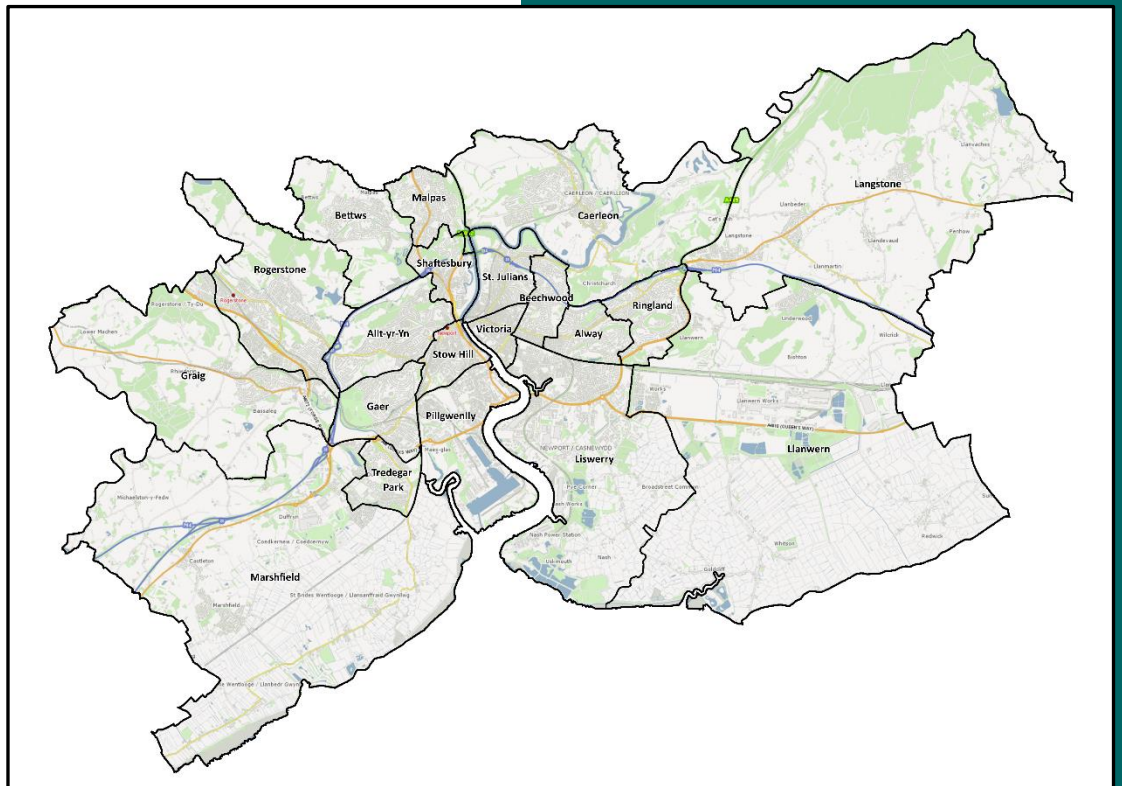

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## Preface

### What this profile is

This profile aggregates data from the 6 Local Area Well-being Assessments that were created as part of the Regional Gwent Well-being Assessment which can be found [here](#). This profile provides data at a Ward level; data for the Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) that make up the wards can be found in the corresponding Local Area Well-being Assessments as shown below.

Some of Newport City Council's ward boundaries recently changed after the Welsh Government decided to accept the recommendations of the Local Democracy and Boundary Commission for Wales. This assessment is based on the previous ward boundaries as the local area documents were created before the changes were enacted. Further details on the changes can be found [here](#). In addition, data taken from the census is based on the 2011 census. Limited data from the 2021 census has been released, however we will update all of the relevant information when the full census data is released later this year.

### What this profile tells us

As part of the development of the Regional Well-being Assessment, a survey was sent to residents of Gwent. 265 people who live in Newport responded. Some of the key themes and needs they identified were:

- Concerns over anti-social behaviour.
- Better public transport infrastructure.
- Appreciation of the green spaces in Newport.
- Less litter.
- More local amenities and independent shops.
- More opportunities to celebrate Welsh language and culture.

Newport's Local Area Well-being Assessments identified the following differences between Newport and the rest of Gwent:

- Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation (WIMD) - almost half of the most deprived LSOAs in Gwent for the Community Safety domain are within Newport.
- Crime levels – Newport has a crime level of over 100 per 1,000 population which is the highest in Gwent.
- Road traffic – Newport has the highest volume of road traffic in Gwent.
- Universal credit claimants – 7.3% of the adult population compared to 5.9% for Gwent as a whole.
- Tourism – Newport experienced 25% growth in tourism 2015-19 and has the highest levels in Gwent.
- Air quality – Newport currently has 9 Air Quality Management Areas, compared to 4 for the rest of Gwent.
- Flooding – Newport is at significantly higher risk of river flooding than any other area in Gwent and the top 5 communities at risk of flooding within Gwent are all in Newport.

- Ethnic diversity – Newport is the most ethnically diverse area of Gwent, with 10.09% of residents from a non-white background compared to 3.88% in Gwent as a whole.

The following key facts about Newport as a whole can be seen from the data:

- Population growth – much higher than Wales: 14.9% growth from 2011 – 2020 compared to 6.78% growth for the whole of Wales over the same time period. Growth is not evenly spread, however, ranging from growth of 68.27% in Pillgwenlly to population reduction of 10.79% in Caerleon.
- Overall WIMD – 20% of Newport LSOAs are within the 10% most deprived in Wales.
- Workless households – 13% compared to 16.5% for Wales.
- Percentage of Year 13 school leavers that are Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET) – significantly lower than average for Wales – 1.09% compared to 2.29%.
- Obesity – higher than Welsh average – 32.35% of adults are obese compared to 24.08% in Wales overall.
- Access to services WIMD – only 2.1% of Newport LSOAs are within the 10% most deprived in Wales.
- Homelessness - Rate of households accepted to be eligible, unintentionally homeless and in priority need per 10,000 households 59.09 in Newport compared to 22.52 in Wales overall.

## Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015

The Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 is about improving the social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being of Wales. It is to ensure that public bodies listed in the Act think more about the long-term, work better with people and communities and each other, look to prevent problems and take a more joined-up approach.

The Act sets out a “sustainable development principle” which is about how the public bodies listed in the Act should go about meeting their well-being duty under the Act. The principle is made up of five ways of working that public bodies are required to take into account when applying sustainable development. These are:



- Looking to the **long term** so that we do not compromise the ability of future generations to meet their own needs;
- Understanding the root causes of issues to **prevent** them from occurring;
- Taking an **integrated** approach so that public bodies look at all the well-being goals in deciding on their well-being objectives;
- Working with others in a **collaborative** way to find shared sustainable solutions;
- **Involving** a diversity of the population in the decisions that affect them.

The Act sets seven well-being goals, which together provide a shared vision for the public bodies listed in the Act to work towards. These goals must be considered as an integrated set of seven to ensure that the relevant links are made in the context of improving the economic, social, environmental and cultural well-being of Wales.



In addition to the well-being duty placed on listed individual public bodies, the Act also sets a well-being duty on specified public bodies to act jointly via public services boards (PSBs) by contributing to the achievement of the well-being goals

### Assessment of Local Well-being

As part of this joint well-being duty a PSB must prepare and publish an assessment of the state of economic, social, environmental and cultural well-being.

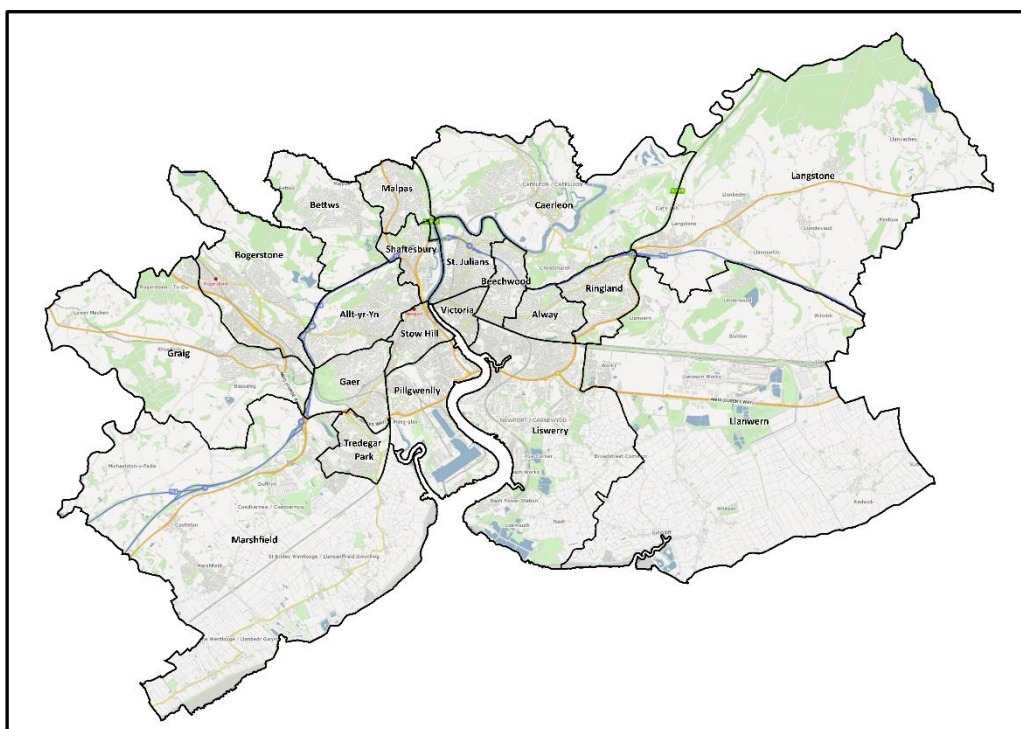
The assessment must provide an accurate analysis of the state of well-being in each community and in the area as a whole.

From this assessment each PSB must prepare and publish a Local Well-being Plan setting out its objectives and the steps it will take to meet them.

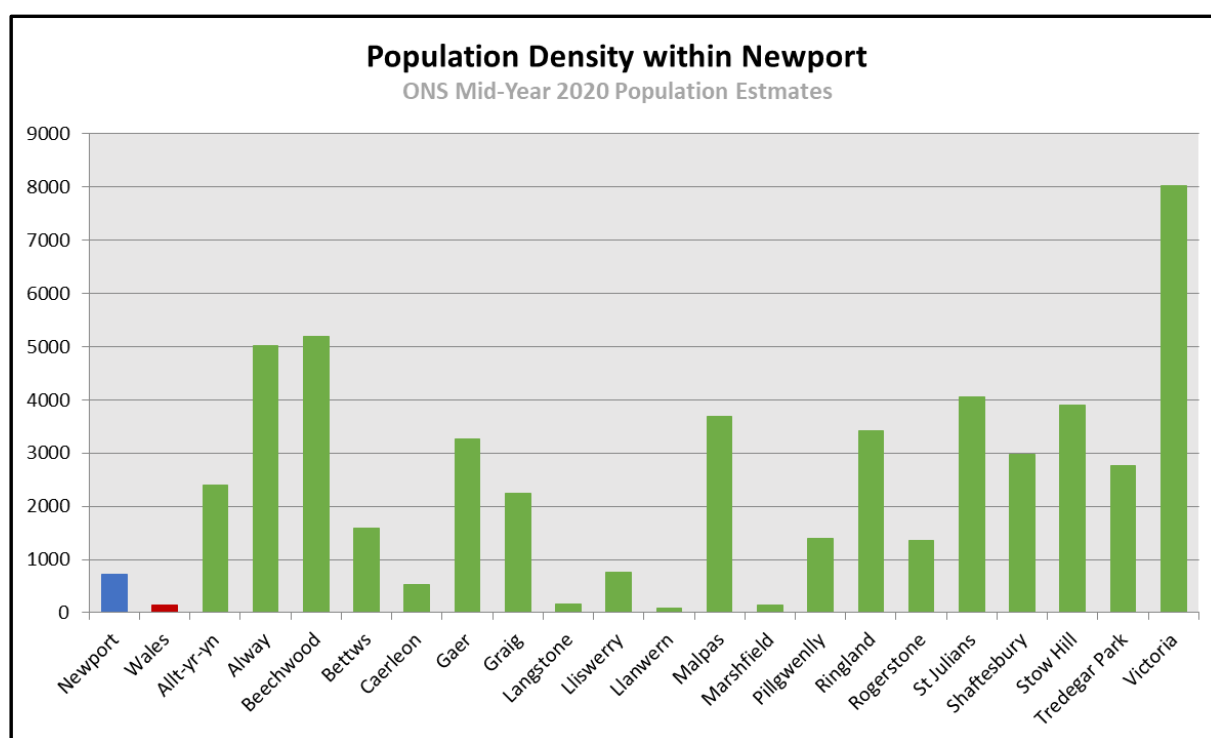

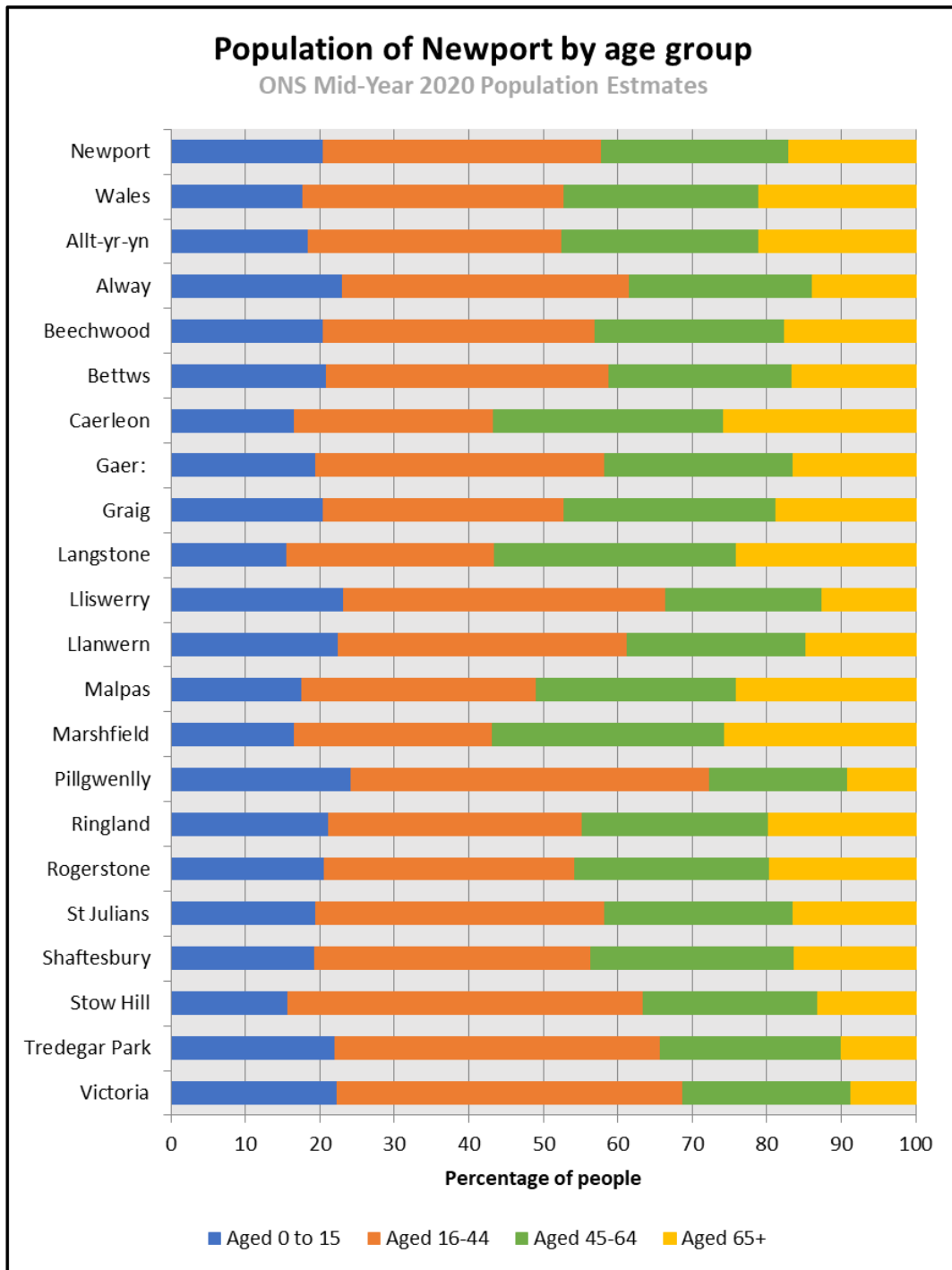

## Ethnicity and Identity

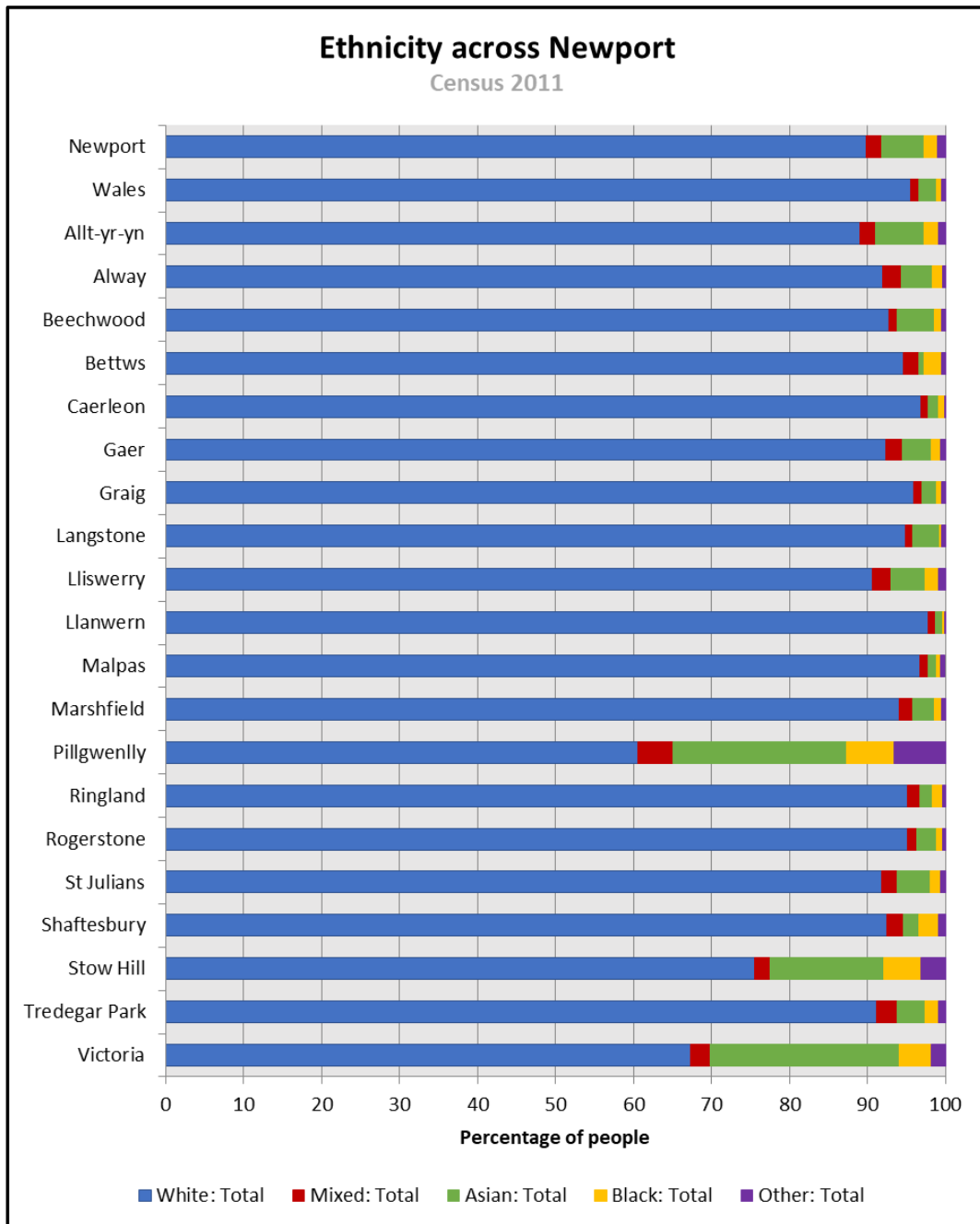

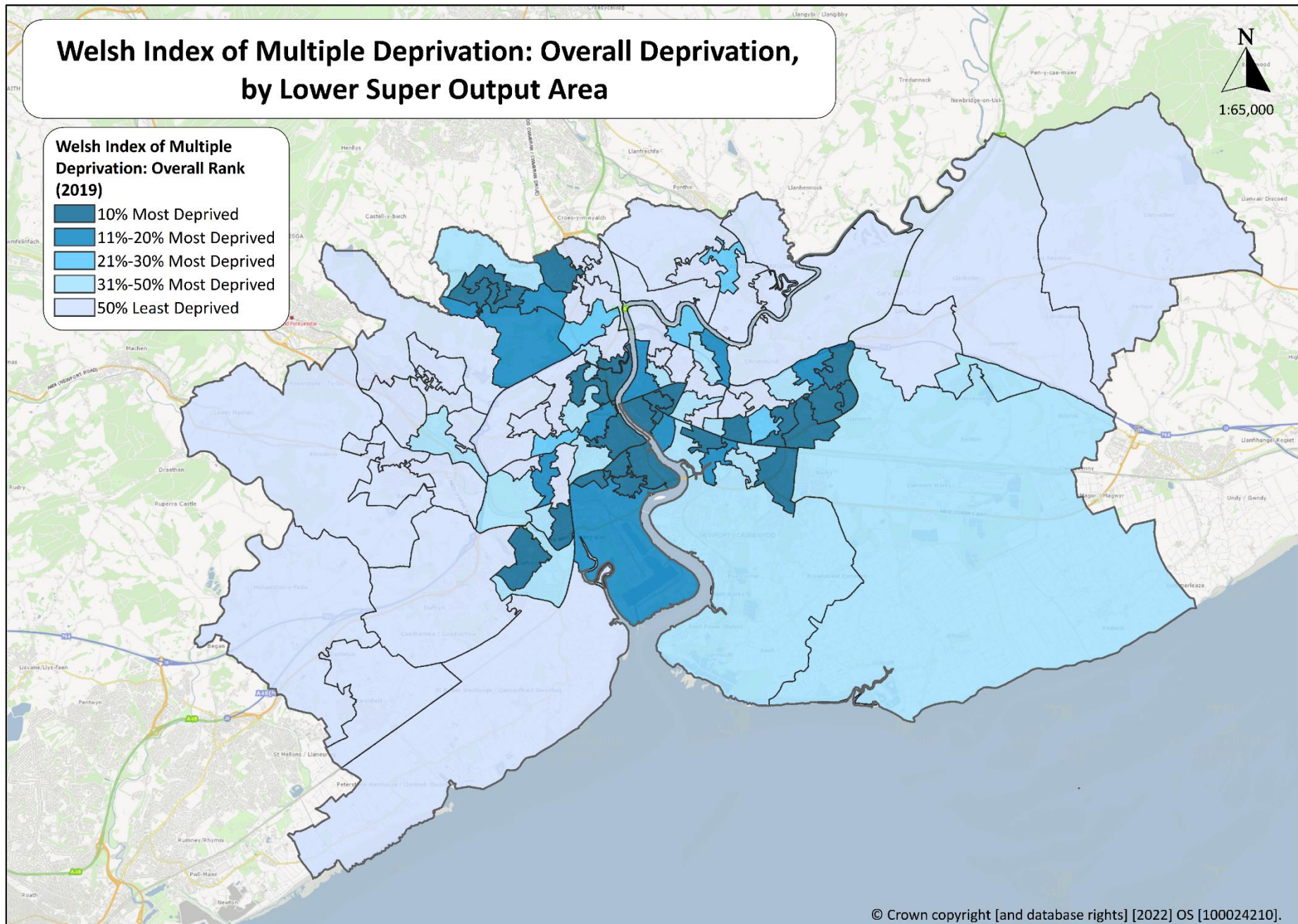

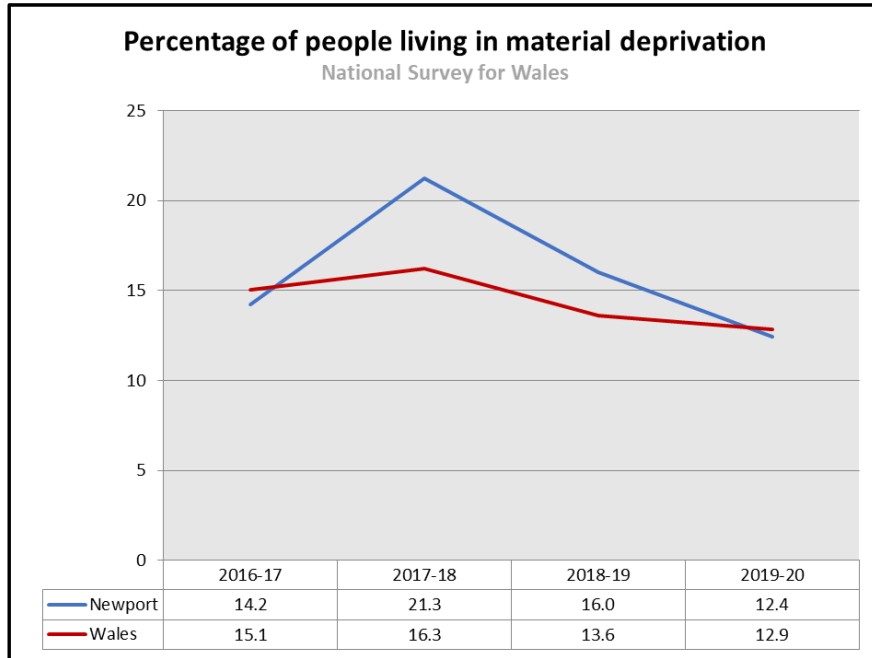
The thematic image shows the WIMD rank for each designated Lower Super Output Area within Newport.

**Newport: South Wales**

**Grant in Aid**

- In the funding year 2020-2021, a total of **£1,266,383** was awarded to arts organisations and individuals within Newport City Council through 3 funds: Grant in Aid, The National Lottery Fund and CLTA
- Until 2020, arts attendance in South East Wales (% attending once a year or more) increased YOY (+14.4% between 2016-2019). In 2020 attendance dropped to 75.7% (down from 88.4% in 2019).
- Until 2020, participation (% participating at least once a year) increased YOY, (+13.2% between 2016-2019). In 2020, participation dropped to 50.6% (down from 57.2% in 2019).

**Grant in Aid**

- Around 70% of all funding (£889,152) was distributed through Grant in Aid funds
- Covid-19 Recovery funds made up over half (£457,805) of Grant in Aid funding
- Just under half (£381,922) was awarded to APW organisations (Riverfront and Ballet Cymru)

**National Lottery Fund**

- Over a quarter of all funding awarded to Newport was Lottery funding (£347,231)
- Connect and Flourish, a fund intended for the development of collaborative proposals, accounted for the largest proportion of lottery funding (£148,174)
- 2 organisations received Connect and Flourish funding (Mr and Mrs Clark & Urban Circle)
- Combined, these organisations proposed 8 exhibitions, 320 performances and 281 participatory sessions

**Creative Learning through the Arts**

- In 2020-21, CLTA, a fund designed to ensure accessibility in learning, and to place creativity at the heart of the curriculum, made up 2% of Newport funding (£30,000)
- Since 2015, 96.4% of schools in Newport engaged with the scheme, investing £729,658 in total over 5 years

**Newport: South Wales**

**Covid-19 Emergency Funding**

On 30 July 2020, the Welsh Government announced £53 million for a Covid-19 Cultural Recovery Fund. £27.5m of that fund was earmarked for distribution by the Arts Council of Wales. £553,179 of that went to organisations and individuals within Newport City Council

**Cultural Recovery Fund**

- 35 individuals and organisations were funded for projects across Wales (plus 24 projects outside Wales)
- Nearly half (£268,961) of the fund went to COVID-19 Cultural Recovery Fund (Revenue)
- In total, there were 50,254 proposed attendances to 1,785 proposed exhibitions, performances, training sessions and workshop sessions
- Within the Covid-19 Urgent Response Fund for Individuals, 7 freelancers were funded through the Arts Resilience Freelancer scheme.

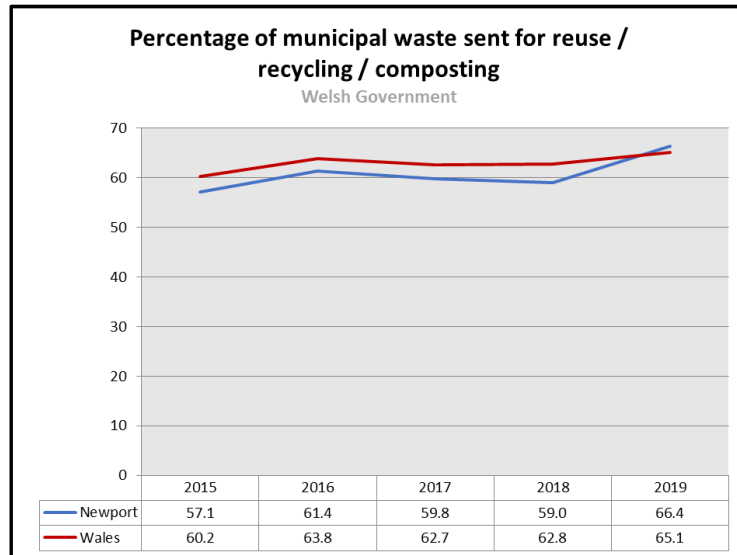

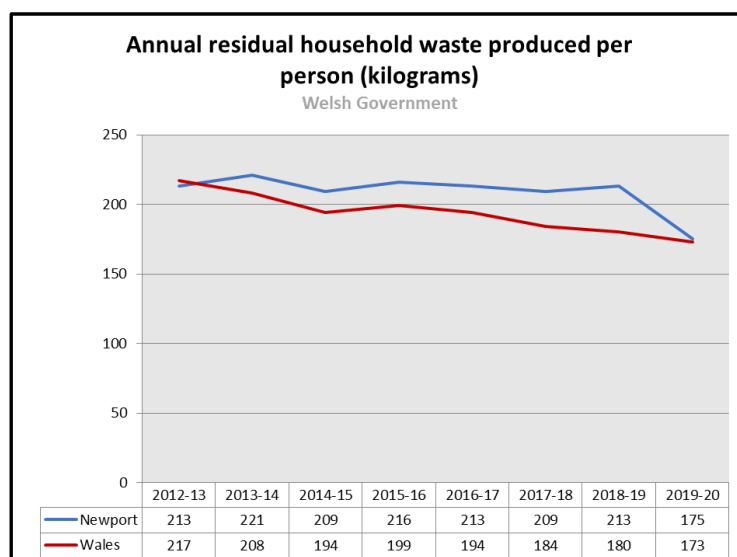
