Formal Joint Consultation to reduce the capacity and extend the age range at Malpas Church in Wales Primary School with effect from September 2024

19 June - 30 July 2023





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Introduction

This is a formal consultation on a joint proposal put forward by the Governing Body of Malpas Church in Wales Primary School together with Newport City Council:

"To reduce the published admission number of the school from 54 to 45 from September 2024; and to extend the age range from 4-11 to 3-11 with effect from September 2025"

This is your chance to ask questions and make comments that will be considered when the Council decides how to proceed.

This formal consultation period:

- Begins on 19 June 2023
- Ends at midnight on 30 July 2023

Background

Malpas Church in Wales Primary School is an English-medium voluntary controlled primary school located on Yewberry Close, in the Malpas ward. The school has a published admission number (PAN) of 54 pupils with an age range of 4-11 years.

Over recent years, the number of pupils attending Malpas Church in Wales Primary School has decreased significantly. As of January 2023 there were 25% surplus places at the school. Pupil forecasts indicate that the number of surplus places will continue to increase at the school over the next 5 years.

Malpas Church in Wales Primary School is the only primary school in the Newport High School cluster that does not provide a nursery class. Previously, pupils attending Kimberley Nursery School would often progress to Malpas Church in Wales Primary School. In March 2021, the proposal to amalgamate Fairoak Nursery School and Kimberley Nursery School into a single nursery school on the Fairoak Nursery site from September 2021 was approved. Therefore, from September 2021, the availability of maintained nursery places in the Malpas/Bettws area has been reduced by 80. During the consultation to amalgamate the nursery schools, the leadership team at Malpas Church in Wales Primary School raised concerns about the potential impact of this decision on the number of pupils attending the school.

By bringing forward this proposal it is intended to provide equity of provision under a 3-11 model across all primary schools within the Newport High School cluster. It will also make good use of the available space and provide stability for planning and staffing the classes in the school.



The Consultation Process

As part of the 'School Standards and Organisation (Wales) Act 2013', before a proposal is published, first it must be subject to consultation. The consultation process is made up of a number of stages, as presented in the table below:

Consultation

The consultation period represents stage I of the consultation process and is an opportunity for people to learn about the proposal, ask questions and make comments that will be recorded and summarised in a consultation report. This report will be published on Malpas Church in Wales Primary School's website and the Council's website and will be considered when the Governing Body of Malpas Church in Wales Primary School and the Council decide on the way forward.

The consultation will involve 2 drop-in sessions with those affected by the proposal, where school staff/ governors and Council officers will be on hand to explain the proposal in more detail and answer any questions:

What do you have to consider?

The remainder of this document sets out the rationale for the proposal. We would like you to consider the information contained within the document and to hear your views as to whether or not you support the proposal.



The Proposal

This is a joint proposal by Newport City Council and the Governing Body of Malpas Church in Wales Primary School.

- the Council proposes to reduce the Published Admission Number (PAN) of the school from 54 to 45 from September 2024, resulting in the school capacity being reduced by 63 pupil places from 378 to 315, and;
- the Governing Body proposes to extend the age range of the school from 4-11 years to 3-11 years from September 2025, enabling the establishment a 16-place nursery class as at this date.

Over the past 5 years the number of pupils that attend Malpas Church in Wales Primary School has been decreasing. Malpas Church in Wales Primary School forms part of the Newport High cluster, which includes Crindau Primary, Malpas Church in Wales Primary, Malpas Court Primary, Malpas Park Primary, Millbrook Primary and Monnow Primary schools.

In the academic year 2017/18 there were a total of 367 pupils on roll at Malpas Church in Wales Primary school, but this decreased to 300 pupils in 2021/22; leaving 20.63% surplus places at the school. Numbers at the other schools in the cluster have remained relatively stable during this time. Pupil forecasts suggest that by 2026/27 there will only be 243 pupils at Malpas Church in Wales Primary School, resulting in 35.71% surplus places. The decreasing number of pupils will make planning and managing the school difficult, and potentially leave parts of the school unused which is not cost-effective.

The school currently operates on a 2 form-entry basis, with two linked classes of up to 27 pupils in each year group.

It is proposed that the pupil admission number (PAN) of the school is reduced from 54 to 45 across the school from September 2024. However, the reduced PAN would not affect any pupils already on roll at the school. Therefore, if on the implementation date any year group contained more than 45 children, these children would continue to attend the school and would not be displaced. The new PAN would therefore apply to any current year groups operating at or below that number, and any future admissions only.

Reducing the PAN will reduce the number of surplus places, making planning and managing the school easier and more cost-effective, and enable the Governing Body to extend the age range of the school to support establishment of a nursery class. This will provide Early Years education places and increase consistency and familiarity for pupils who then transition into Reception class the following year.

Establishing a nursery class will increase the number of funded nursery places available across the city and enable positive transition into statutory mainstream education. The nursery class will utilise a classroom which can be made available due to low pupil numbers currently attending the school.

Affected Schools

The school directly affected by this proposal is Malpas Church in Wales Primary School. It is not expected that any other school will be significantly affected. However, due to proximity and the proposed establishment of a nursery class, there is a possibility of a small impact on Malpas Park Primary School:

• Malpas Park Primary School (0.7 miles). Malpas Park Primary School is an English-language community maintained primary school. It has an admission number of 30 for Reception to Year 6 classes and a nursery admission number of 32.



The above school could potentially be affected in three possible ways:

1) The new nursery school places at Malpas Church result in lower nursery intakes in neighbouring schools.

In the past, families living in the Malpas Church in Wales Primary School catchment area have made use of the other local nursery schools, with the majority attending Kimberley Nursery School. Following the amalgamation of Kimberley and Fairoak nursery schools on the Fairoak site from September 2021, the other schools in the area, notably Malpas Park Primary School, have taken more nursery age pupils from the Malpas Church catchment area. The creation of a nursery class at Malpas Church in Wales Primary School may therefore have limited impact on nursery pupil numbers at Malpas Park Primary School. However, the proposal would most likely return numbers to levels similar to those experienced before the amalgamation of Kimberley and Fairoak nursery schools.

 Children attending Malpas Church Primary School nursery could choose to apply for a Reception place there, when they may otherwise have attended another local nursery and school.

Birth rates for the school catchment area suggest that the school has historically taken a significant proportion of out-of-catchment pupils from the wider area. If all in-catchment pupils attend Malpas Church in Wales Primary School, the impact on other local schools is not expected to be significant when compared to recent years.

3) If demand for statutory-age school places in the area increases, and Malpas Church in Wales Primary School becomes over-subscribed, neighbouring schools may see an increase in applications for school places.

Pupil forecasts indicate that pupil populations will remain stable or decrease slightly over the coming years. Intake numbers at Malpas Church in Wales Primary School are not expected to exceed 40 pupils, and all other schools in the cluster are expected to be operating within their existing capacities.

Reduction in Published Admission Number (PAN) from 54 to 45

The school currently operates on a 2 form-entry basis, with two linked classes of up to 27 pupils in each year group. This provides a total of 378 pupil places across the seven statutory age year groups. Declining pupil numbers, with particularly low Reception intakes in the last three years have resulted in an increasing number of surplus places at the school, and present some challenges for the school in budget management, staffing and class structure.

From September 2024, it is proposed that the PAN will reduce to 45 from 54 across all year groups. However, the reduced PAN would not affect any pupils already on roll at the school. Therefore, if on the implementation date any year group contained more than 45 children, these children would continue to attend the school and would not be displaced. The new PAN would apply to any current year groups operating at or below that number, and any future admissions only.

Forecast Pupil Numbers – Newport High Cluster Primary Schools

Table 5, above, shows a forecast position of 366 surplus places across the cluster by 2026-27. This equates to almost 20% and is double the amount considered suitable to manage in-year migration and enable efficient budget management. A significant proportion of these surplus places are forecast to be at Malpas Church in Wales Primary School.

Impact of Reduced PAN in Malpas Church in Wales Primary School 2024 - 2027

The table below shows that by reducing the admission number to 45, the number of surplus places across the school is reduced considerably by 2026/27, from 135 (35.71%) shown in tables 3 and 5; to 72 (22.86%).

Extending the age range of the school to 3-11 years and thereby establishing a 16-place (FTE) nursery class

Extending the age range of the school will support the establishment of a nursery class. This in turn will increase the number of funded nursery places available across the city and enable positive transition into statutory mainstream education. The nursery class will utilise a classroom which can be made available due to low pupil numbers currently attending. This will provide Early Years education places in the school and increase consistency and familiarity for pupils who then transition into Reception class the following year.



The table on the following page shows the number of funded nursery and Early Years places available in the local area, and the number of unfilled places at the last two census dates. This indicates that there are very few funded 'rising 3' nursery/Early Years places available in the local area.

Current and Past Pupil Numbers – Local Nursery Classes

Chuckles Nursery and Tiny Tots Nursery are both non-maintained settings. Chuckles Nursery had an extension built in 2021/22 which increased the number of registered places offered from 24 to 32. Due to demand in early 2020 Tiny Tots Nursery also increased the number of registered places offered from 18 to 24. This shows there is demand for nursery places within the Malpas and Bettws area.

Impact of extending the age range and therefore creating a 16-place nursery class at Malpas Church in Wales Primary School

The proposed establishment of a nursery class at Malpas Church in Wales Primary School will create an additional 32 half-day Early Years education places in the Malpas area. It is anticipated that this will encourage parents living in the locality to take up these funded education places. The increased availability of nursery places will result in more 'rising 3' places being available for children giving parents more options for nursery education. It will also help to address the gap in provision that can occur when children leave Flying Start at 3 years of age. This in turn should help improve children's transition into mainstream education at the age of four.

If uptake of nursery places in the area does not improve as a result of the increased offer, then a similar number of pupils as currently attend nursery classes could be spread across more local providers. In this case some providers, including the new provision, may reduce their offer by running morning or afternoon sessions only.



Building Condition

The current condition of the buildings affected by this proposal has been judged on a scale of A to D as follows:

What Will The Proposal Provide?

The joint proposal will legally reduce the PAN of Malpas Church in Wales Primary School from 54 to 45 from September 2024 and will see the capacity of the school reduced by 63 places from 378 to 315 from this date; as a consequence, the age range of the school will be extended from 4-11 to 3-11 from September 2025, enabling the establishment of a nursery class from this same date.


The school operates on a 2 form-entry basis, with two linked classes of up to 27 pupils in each year group. However, due to lower intake numbers in recent years education is currently provided in mixed aged classes across Reception and Year I. It is anticipated that mixed-age class arrangements will be needed for the foreseeable future, due to the low class numbers.

The proposal will involve a formalised shift towards mixed age classes in more than one year group in the school. An illustration of how the school could operate with 45 pupils per year group is shown below. Operationally, the structure will depend on actual numbers on roll in each year group at any given time.

Quality and Standards

Quality and standards in schools in Newport are monitored by Estyn and the Local Authority (LA). Estyn is the office of His Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education and Training in Wales. It is a Crown body, established under the Education Act 1992. Estyn is independent of the National Assembly for Wales but receives its funding from the Welsh Government under Section 104 of the Government of Wales Act 1998. Estyn inspects quality and standards in education and training providers in Wales.

Malpas Church in Wales Primary School's last inspection was November 2019 and resulted in the school being placed into the "special measures" category.

Since this last inspection, performance against all inspection areas has significantly improved under the leadership of a new Headteacher and Chair of Governors. The Governing Body has also been strengthened through new and additional governors whose skills have complemented those of longer-standing and experienced individuals.

In November 2022, Estyn undertook a monitoring visit, and judged that the school had made sufficient progress in relation to the recommendations made in the core inspection. As a result, His Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education and Training in Wales took the decision to remove the school from the list of schools requiring special measures.



Consideration of the potential impact of the proposal on quality and standards is aligned with the Estyn Inspection framework which has been updated for the 2022 academic year:

Learning

The proposal will not affect the standards and progress of learning in any other schools. It is expected that the proposal will have a positive impact on Learning at Malpas Church in Wales Primary School and will improve baseline capability on entering Reception class. The school will continue to receive the appropriate level of challenge and support to ensure pupils develop the key attitudes and behaviours that will help them through their lives and achieve high standards in their skills development and make progress.

Wellbeing and attitudes to learning

Pupil well-being is paramount. Pupil well-being will be monitored through the school's strategic planning and self-evaluation processes and through the local authority's 'Learn-Well' group. Malpas Church in Wales Primary School will provide pupils with a learning environment in which they feel safe and secure and where they become healthy and confident individuals. The proposed nursery class will enable the school to begin this work earlier, and therefore more effectively meet pupil needs.

Teaching and learning experiences

The quality of teaching and learning experiences will be monitored through the school's strategic planning and self-evaluation processes, with the school receiving the appropriate levels of challenge and support to ensure that Malpas Church in Wales Primary School's vision for teaching and learning is aligned to the New Curriculum, in Wales. The curriculum will be delivered through the medium of English with classroom practices successfully engaging all pupils to develop their skills, knowledge and understanding to an appropriately high level as they move through the school. By establishing a nursery class at the school will provide positive transition into statutory mainstream education.

Care support and guidance

The quality of provision for care, support and guidance will be monitored through the school's strategic planning and self-evaluation processes. The school will receive the appropriate levels of challenge and support to ensure provision for pupils' personal development and learning support meets the needs of pupils in a culture which promotes pupils' spiritual, moral, social, and cultural development. The proposed nursery class will enable the school to begin this work earlier, and therefore more effectively meet pupil needs.

Leadership and management

The proposed changes are intended to reduce surplus places at the school and stabilise class numbers thereby making budget planning less challenging. It is expected that this will have a positive effect on leadership and management At Malpas Church in Wales Primary School. The school's Leadership will receive an appropriate level of challenge and support to ensure that the school vision is well communicated and that the school's aims, strategic objectives, plans and policies focus on meeting the needs of pupils; so pupils achieve well and a safeguarding culture is promoted.

Additional Learning Needs (ALN) provision

There are three primary schools within the Newport High School cluster which host specialist ALN classes. These are at Monnow Primary School (20 places), Crindau Primary School (20 places) and Malpas Court Primary School (16 speech & language impairment places). There is no specialist ALN provision planned for Malpas Church in Wales Primary School, and this proposal will have no effect on the existing provision within the cluster or elsewhere in Newport.



Impact on Welsh language provision

In October 2021, a parental survey was published online by Welsh Government that was developed in collaboration with Local Authority Childcare leads to inform the local Childcare Sufficiency Assessment. The parental survey was a national approach and Newport received 619 complete responses to the survey.

21% of respondents indicated that they would like to consider Welsh-medium childcare. The survey report concluded that availability and distance of travel appear to be the largest issues facing use of Welsh Medium childcare¹.

From September 2023 there will be 22 AM and 22 PM Welsh-medium Flying Start placements for 2-3 year olds provided at Ysgol Gymraeg Ifor Hael which is located in the Bettws area.

There are 19 registered education places in Cylch Meithrin Brynglas for 3-4 year olds.

There are 30 maintained nursery places for 3-4 year olds offered at Ysgol Gymraeg lfor Hael which is located in the Bettws area. The nursery currently offers 'morning only' sessions, therefore if demand for Welsh-medium nursery places increases, the school can potentially offer another 30 places in an afternoon session. The table below shows there has been sufficient places in the Nursery class over the past 6 years.

**Ysgol Gymraeg Ifor Hael currently operates a 'morning only' nursery.															

Therefore, there is sufficient Welsh-medium education provision in the Malpas and Bettws areas for children between the ages of 2 and 4 years old.

Ysgol Gymraeg Ifor Hael provides Welsh-medium education in the Bettws and Malpas communities. The school has a PAN of 30 and a Reception to Year 6 capacity of 210 pupils. Current forecasts suggest the school will have approximately 18% surplus places in the next few years, suggesting sufficiency of local provision for the short to medium term.

This proposal is to reduce the PAN and establish a nursery class at an English-medium school. The proposal has no impact on the Council's plans for growing Welsh-medium education provision across

Newport as outlined in our 10-year Welsh in Education Strategic Plan. Details of the factors considered in making this proposal are contained within the Fairness and Equalities Impact Assessment.

Impact on other schools

The proposal will have no detrimental impact on other Newport schools. Any impact on Malpas Park Primary School's nursery intake could be fairly easily managed.

When Will This Be Effective?

The proposal is to legally reduce the Malpas Church in Wales Primary school PAN from 54 to 45 from September 2024 which sees the capacity of the school reduced by 63 places from 378 to 315 and extend the age range from 4-11 to 3-11 by establishing a nursery class at the school with effect from September 2025.

Cost

<u>Capital</u>

The proposal will require some small alterations to classrooms. These costs are not expected to be significant and will be funded from the school's budget.

<u>Revenue</u>

The recurring costs associated with the staffing and running of the school will be met by Newport City Council through the school's delegated budget. The school and governing body are confident that the staffing costs for the nursery can be met from the school's budget. School funding is based on pupil numbers which are currently below the proposed capacity of the school. The proposal will not therefore negatively impact funding.

Alternative Options Considered

The proposal has two elements, concerning both the admission number and therefore school capacity, and the age range – whether the school should have a nursery class. A range of options have been considered, as set out below, and each combination of options has also been considered to determine the preferred way forward.

Of the above options, option 2 is the preferred option. Reducing the PAN to 45 helps to manage staffing levels and the school budget and reduces surplus places. It also releases space which can be



used to provide nursery places, while leaving some capacity for any future growth in pupil numbers due to demographic change, parental choice and migration

Age range (nursery provision)

Of the above options, option 2 is the preferred option. Establishing a small nursery of 16 morning and 16 afternoon sessions will be manageable and limit any potential impact on other nursery providers, while still offering the benefits of Early Years education places in an established school setting.

On the basis of the above the proposal is to reduce the PAN to 45 and extend the age range of the school to 3-11; establishing a 16-place (Full Time Equivalent) nursey class.

What will the proposal achieve?

The preferred proposal will see a decrease in the Malpas Church in Wales Primary School PAN from 54 to 45, therefore reducing the amount of surplus places forecast from 37% to 22% by 2026/27.

The preferred proposal will also extend the age range of the school from 4-11 to 3-11 by establishing a nursery class which will provide 32 half-day nursery places at the school and achieve a seamless pathway of transition from Nursery to statutory school provision.

School Organisation Arrangements

Catchment area

There will be no changes to the current primary and secondary catchment areas under this proposal.

Admissions

Newport City Council is the admissions authority for Malpas Church in Wales Primary School, and applications for admission will continue to be assessed in accordance with the Council's School Admissions Policy.

In accordance with this policy, parents can express a preference for any school, but there is no guarantee of admission to the chosen school, even if it is the catchment school. Admission to the



school will be made in accordance with parental preference, subject to availability. Where a school is oversubscribed, preference requests will still be considered, but the Council's over-subscription criteria will be applied to determine priority.

Admission to Reception – September 2024

Applications can be made using the council's on-line admissions service between 6th November 2023 and 9th January 2024. Decision notifications for on-time applications will be issued on 16th April 2024.

The proposal may not have been determined before the Reception application window opens. Therefore, parents will be notified when making an application for Malpas Church in Wales Primary School, that the school is subject to a live proposal which if approved will result in reduced capacity; parents will therefore be encouraged to include alternative school preferences when finalising their applications.

Admission to the Year One to Year Six Classes - September 2024

These are denoted as in-year admission requests and can be made via an in-year application form which is available on the council website. In-year transfer applications can be submitted during the summer term 2024. (Exact date to be confirmed) Although existing pupils attending the school will not be displaced, in-year applications that would take the year group over PAN are likely to be refused. Any applications that are refused will be afforded the right of appeal.

Admission to Nursery – September 2025

Applications can be made using the council's on-line admissions service between July and September 2024. Decision notifications for on-time applications will likely be issued in December 2024. (Exact dates to be confirmed)

Transport

Where appropriate, transport is provided in accordance with the Council's policy. There are identified safe areas for the drop-off and collection of pupils, and this will not be affected by this proposal. The Council's policy only applies to children of statutory school age and therefore the creation of a nursery class at the school will have no impact on these arrangements.

Governance

There will be no changes to school governance arrangements as a result of this proposal. The governing body will continue in its current form.

Staffing

There may be staffing implications for Malpas Church in Wales Primary School in terms of reducing teaching and support staff where necessary to support the reduction in pupil numbers in Reception – Y6. This includes taking into account the additional Nursery class added. This will be managed by the Headteacher and Governing Body with support from the Council's Human Resources & Occupational Development Team.



Risks

The risks associated with this proposal, and mitigating factors are listed below:
